Say This

Who made everything?

God made everything.

Activity

Creation Tunnel

What You Need

Blankets, chairs, and a flashlight (cellphone flashlight is fine)

What You Do

During the Activity: Drape the blankets over chairs to create a darkened fort. Crawl into the fort with your child as you shine the flashlight, turning it on and off. Talk about how God made the light and dark. Talk about how God made other things, like the sky and water.

What You Say

Before the Activity: "Look at what I have! We can use these blankets and chairs to make a fort. Will you help me?

During the Activity: "Crawl inside with me. It's a little dark, but watch this. (Shine the flashlight on and off inside the box.) Light! (on) Dark. (off) Light! (on) Dark. (off—repeat as desired) God made the light and dark on day one!

"What did God make on day two? When you go outside and look up, what do you see? The sky! That's right. What else did God make on day two? When you go to the beach and stand on the shore and look out, what to do you see? Water! That's right. God made the sky and water on day two!

After the Activity: "God made light and dark on day one, then He made sky and water on day two. God made everything! Who made everything? God made everything."



Prayer

"God, in the very beginning, there was nothing: no people, no animals, no land, no ocean, no sun, no earth, nothing. But there was YOU! On the first day, You made light and dark. On the second day, You make sky and water. Thank You for making so many wonderful things for us to enjoy. Thank You God that You made everything! Amen"



Bible Story

Land, Plants, Sea and Sun, Moon, Stars (Genesis 1:9–19)

Remember This

"God saw everything he had made. And it was very good." Genesis 1:31, NIrV

Say This

Who made everything? God made everything.

Activity

This or That

What You Need

Paper, crayons and tape

What You Do

Before the Activity: Sit down with your child and draw two pictures—one of the sun and one of the moon and stars. Tape the pictures on opposite walls.

During the Activity: Have your child stand with you in the center of the room as you call out the activities listed below. If it is a daytime activity, ask your child to jump to the sun. If it is a nighttime activity, ask your child to jump to the moon. Ask your child to rejoin you in the center before calling out the next activity.

Daytime activities include: Go to school, play in the sunshine, eat breakfast, and eat lunch.

Nighttime activities include: Hear a bedtime story, go to sleep, eat dinner, see stars, see the moon.

What You Say

Before the Activity: "Let's play a game with our pictures. Our game area has one side (point to the sun) for daytime and one side (point to the moon and stars) for nighttime. Stand in the center with me and listen closely! When I say something that you do during the day, let's jump to the daytime side. When I say something that you do at night, let's jump to the nighttime side! Are you ready?" (Pause and do activity).

After the Activity: "Way to go! God made everything, including the sun, moon, and stars. Tell me, who made everything?" God made everything!"



Prayer

"God, You made so many amazing things! Thank You for giving us the sun, moon, and stars. You can do anything. Thank You for making everything. Amen."

Bible Story

Birds and Fish (Genesis 1:20-21)

Remember This

"God saw everything he had made. And it was very good." Genesis 1:31, NIrV

Say This

Who made everything? God made everything.

Activity

Fish and Birds

What You Need

Towel (blue, if possible) and colored (balled up) socks

What You Do

Before the Activity: Lay the towel on the floor in the center of a room. Have your child stand at one end of the towel while you stand at the other.

During the Activity: Toss the socks onto the center of the towel. Explain that when the towel is on the floor, the socks are like fish, swimming in the water. Encourage your child to bend down and grab the towel with both hands, then stand up. You and your child will pop the towel so that the socks fly in the air like birds! Then have them lay the towel down flat again as the water holding the fish. Repeat as time and interest allow.

What You Say

Before the Activity: "Come stand at the end of this towel. I'll stand on this side. What did God make that swims in the water? (*Pause.*) Yes, fish! Let's add some fish to this towel. (*Put the socks onto the center of the towel.*) God made all the fish in the sea on day five!"

During the Activity: "But that's not ALL God made on day five. God made birds on day five, too! Carefully bend down and grab the towel with both hands. I will count down from three, then I want you to stand up and pop the towel to make these socks fly like birds. Ready? Three, two, one! Pop! Look at those birds fly."

After the Activity: "God made all the fish and all the birds on day five. Isn't that the coolest? Say, 'Yay, God!' (Pause.) God made everything! Who made everything? God made everything."

Prayer

"God, thank You for making beautiful fish that swim and colorful birds that fly. God, You made everything, and it is so good! Thank You, God!"



Bible Story

Animals and People (Genesis 1:24-31)

Remember This

"God saw everything he had made. And it was very good." Genesis 1:31, NIrV

Say This

Who made everything? God made everything.

Activity

Animal Dance

What You Need

Music player and the monthly song, "Things I See" (available on OrangeKidsMusic.com or search for Orange Kids on Spotify®, or Apple Music®)

What You Do

During the Activity: Play song and dance with your child to the music. Stop the song periodically and ask them to act like any animal they want. Repeat several times.

What You Say

Before the Activity: "Let's dance together!"

During the Activity: "When the music stops, act like an animal God made!" (Do activity.)

After the Activity: "You have some awesome dance moves! That was so fun. God made all the animals! Tell me, who made everything? **God made everything!**"



Prayer

"God, You made all the animals in the entire world! That's amazing! And You made me. You made [kid's name, other family and friends' names]. You made so many amazing things because You can do anything. God, thank You for making everything!"



Bible Story

God Rested (Genesis 1:1–2:3)

Remember This

"God saw everything he had made. And it was very good." Genesis 1:31, NIrV

Say This

Who made everything? God made everything.

Activity

Animal Verse Search

What You Need

Several plush friends

What You Do

Before the Activity: Place the plush friends around the room.

During the Activity: Call out an animal. When your child spots it, lead them over to say the verse to that plush friend. Return to the activity area and call out another animal. Repeat until you've traveled and said the verse to each plush friend.

What You Say

Before the Activity: "Do you see our plush friends around the room? Do you see a [animal in your activity area]?"

During the Activity: "Good job! Let's go over and say our memory verse to the [animal's name].

'God (point up) saw everything he had made. (Binocular hands, look around) And it was very good,' (thumbs-up) Genesis 1:31." (Open hands like a book.) (Continue with each animal.)

After the Activity: "That was fun! Great job! God made everything. That includes ALL the animals and every single one of you! Who made everything? God made everything."



Prayer


"God, You made the world and everything in it. You made stars, trees, birds, and me! You made everything. You are amazing, God. You can do anything. Thank You for making everything. Amen."
