MADE TO PLAY

PRELUDE

Before kids arrive, take a few moments to pray for them. Ask God to help kids get excited about taking initiative to get things done. Pray that kids would see initiative as an opportunity to invest in the relationships they have with those they live with and spend time with at school, in the neighborhood, and on the sports field. Ask God to help all of us overcome our natural tendency to say "not my job"

TODAY'S BIBLE STORY

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1. EARLY ARRIVER

STORY

WHAT YOU NEED: Offering container, hand sanitizer, crumpled foil pieces

WHAT YOU DO:

- Welcome kids by name as they arrive.
- Invite kids who brought an offering to put it in the offering container.
- Direct the kids to use one pump of hand sanitizer. •
- Ask: How has the new school year been so far? (If they haven't started yet, ask what they hope for in the new school year.)
- As kids arrive, encourage them to toss a "moon rock" around the group.
- Direct the kid who catches the moon rock to name one thing that could "start" or "begin." (examples a school year, a vacation, a week, a test, etc.)
- For older kids, when they catch a moon rock, ask them to say a synonym for "start." (examples begin, commence, launch, kick-off, premiere, take-off, etc.)
- When a kid shares an answer, instruct them to toss a moon rock to someone else

2. OPENING ACTIVITY

WHAT YOU NEED: "On My List" Activity Page cards

WHAT YOU DO:

- If most of your kids are readers, hand out the cards from the "On My List" Activity Page to the kids. If not, read the cards yourself.
- One by one, direct the kids to read the list they have out loud to the group without sharing the answer at the bottom of the card.
- Instruct the group to guess who that to-do list might belong to.
- If time allows, invite kids to make their own to-do lists, or to make to-do lists for a person/character of their choice.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"These lists showed what was really important to these people! I wonder how they got all that stuff done? I wonder if they need any help? What things would be on your lists? What about on your parents' or teacher's? **[Transition] Let's go to Large Group to hear about something that should definitely be on our to-do lists!**"

Lead your group to the Large Group area.

Makin' Plans

Nehemiah Plans to Rebuild the Wall

Nehemiah 1:1-2:18



1. GANTRY ANTICS [TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW]

WHAT YOU NEED: Large plastic cups, poster tack

WHAT YOU DO:

- Divide the group into two teams.
- Give each team the same number of cups and some

poster tack.

- Direct each team to build two tall towers close together.
- Explain that gantries are the towers or platforms used to prepare a rocket for launch and give astronauts and technicians access to the rocket.
- Instruct the kids to build a gantry by stacking the cups together, using the poster tac on the bottoms of the cups to hold them together and steady.
 - Direct the kids to start with one cup turned upside down on the floor.
 - Demonstrate how to put a small blob of poster tac on the bottom of the cup and attach the bottom of the next cup to it. Press firmly down inside the cup to stick the two together.
 - Show how to balance the top of the next cup on the top that is now standing upright. (Poster tac won't stick to the lips of the cup as easily as it will to the bottom of a cup, so there is no need to use it for this step.)
 - Once the kids see how it is done, direct them to continue building by sticking the bottoms of cups together to make a tall tower.
- The team that builds the tallest gantry, wins!
- You will use the gantries again, so don't let the kids destroy them at the end of the activity.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"I'll bet some of you never thought about who builds the gantry for a rocket launch or even knew what a gantry was! I didn't either! Do you know who puts that astronaut ice cream into the packages? Who sews all those patches? Who cleans all the training equipment? Who figures out the best flight plan and launch date?

"There are a TON of jobs to do, no matter who you are or where you live. Some of them are definitely YOUR jobs. What are those? (*Pause for responses: making bed, doing homework, cleaning up after myself, caring for pets, doing chores.*) There are some jobs that are definitely NOT yours, like driving a car or paying the bills. But there are jobs that are just lying around—SOMEBODY has to do them. Can you think of any of those? (Dishes, laundry, random stuff that needs to get picked up, messy classrooms, litter in the park, sports equipment left after practice, etc.)

"Those jobs might be technically for someone else, or they might just be things that get forgotten. It would be easy not to notice them at all and hope that they just go away. But let's be honest, SOMEBODY has to do them. And today in our Bible story, we learned that the SOMEBODY might as well be you! **Don't** wait for someone else to do what needs to be done.

TODAY'S BOTTOM LINE

Don't wait for someone else to do what needs to be done.

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(1. GANTRY ANTICS, CONTINUED)

Nehemiah didn't wait around for the problems in Jerusalem to just go away on their own. He didn't ask the king to send a team of other people to go fix the mess. Nehemiah decided to do something about it! He made a plan then he started it. He knew that you **don't wait for someone else to do what needs to be done.**"

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*2. SOMEONE ELSE'S PROBLEM

[LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY] WHAT YOU NEED: "Someone Else's Problems" Activity Page cards, squares of light-colored fabric, foil sheets

WHAT YOU DO:

- Give each kid a sheet piece of foil.
- Hold the cards from the "Someone Else's Problems" Activity Page face down and invite the kids to pick one.
- Instruct each kid to read their card but not show it to anyone else.
- Direct the kids to fold the card as small as they can, put it in the middle of the piece of foil, and squish the foil piece into a ball to create a moon rock.
 Give each kid a fabric square
- Give each kid a fabric square.
- Explain that the fabric squares are "force fields" that will make anything they touch into "Someone Else's Problem"—even the card inside the moon rock.
- Encourage kids to use the fabric to try to hide the moon rock as best they can.
- Ask the kids to give their force-field covered moon rock to someone else so their moon rocks (with the job inside) become that new person's problem.
- When all the kids have a covered moon rock, ask them if they are happy that their job is now Someone Else's Problem.
- Ask: Did the force field work?
- Instruct the kids to uncover and open their moon rocks. (They will find that they all have the same job!)

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Well, how did that Someone Else's Problem force field work for you? (*Invite responses.*) See, everyone wants someone else to do the dirty work—to finish the extra chores and take care of the annoying little things that are around us. But what if, this week, you pretended your name was SOMEONE?

"Someone has to clean up this pet's mess. You'd say: I'm on it! Someone has to take this note to the office. You'd say: I'm here to help. Someone has to carry these groceries. You'd say: I've got it! Someone has to clean up the field before we leave. You'd say: I'll grab the trash barrel!

"When you show initiative like that, you **don't wait for someone else to do what needs to be done.** You just do it, as if it was your job all along. You don't wait to be asked or offered a reward or payment, you just jump in and get going!"

Optional Discussion Questions for Older Kids

If you lead 4th, 5th, or 6th graders, consider asking these discussion questions:

- When do you REALLY not like taking care of Someone Else's Problem?
- What do you need to think about or focus on in order to take initiative in that situation?



(*2. SOMEONE ELSE'S PROBLEM, CONTINUED)

• How would your parents, siblings, coaches, or teachers react this week if you **don't wait for someone else to do what needs to be done**? Would they be surprised? Grateful? Would they notice? How would you feel?

3. LIGHT POPCORN [HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: "Popcorn Poster" Activity Page, Bibles

WHAT YOU DO:

- Give each kid a Bible.
- Look up the memory verse using the Bible Navigation

Tips below.

Finding verses with a multi-age group: Guide all kids to open their Bibles to the front and find the table of contents. Hold up a Bible opened to the table of contents to show the kids what the page looks like. When the kids find the table of contents, ask a middle elementary kid (2nd–3rd grade) to find Colossians in the list under "New Testament." When the kid finds Colossians, lead them to look at the page number beside the word and say it, explaining that the number tells them on what page they can find Colossians. Ask older elementary kids (4th–5th grade) to help younger ones find the correct page in their Bibles. When they all find Colossians, explain that the big numbers on the page are the chapter numbers. Ask a kindergartner or 1st grader to find chapter 3, and give time for all the kids to turn the pages to find it. Explain that the small numbers are verse numbers and ask a middle elementary kid to find verse 23 in chapter 3. Then, read the verse aloud slowly, especially for your pre-readers; or ask older elementary kids to read it to the group

- Set out the "Popcorn Poster" Activity Page.
- Gather the group in a circle.
- Instruct the group to sit down.
- Ask the kids if they've ever played "popcorn" with a verse or a sentence. One person jumps up and says a word then the person beside them does the next word, etc.
- Explain that you'll play a different version of the game "popcorn." In this version, you choose the kid to start and anyone can say the next word and the word after that. There are a few catches:
 - If two kids say a word at the same time, the group has to start over.
 - Everyone has to say at least one word of the verse or the group has to start over.
 - If no one says the next word in the verse after ten seconds, the group must start again.
- If you have older kids, instruct them not to talk to each other to plan or strategize; not to call someone's name; and not to point or use their hands. They can look at other kids, but can't strategize in any way.
- Tell the first kid the first word of the verse.
- Eventually, the kids will be able to work together to say the verse a word at a time without prompting.
- Be patient and remind kids not to give up.

(3. LIGHT POPCORN, CONTINUED)

WHAT YOU SAY:

"You did it! How did it feel when you finally got to the end of the verse? (*Invite answers.*) How did you decide when to say what word? (*Pause for responses.*)

"In this game, you had to be ready to step in with a word at any minute, and you couldn't wait too long to do it! What would have happened if no one said a word and everyone waited for someone else to do it? (There wouldn't be a game at all!)

"This game really shows that things do go better if you **don't wait for someone else to do what needs to be done.** I've seen that happen too!"

[Make it Personal] (Share about a time you took initiative and did a job 'someone else' could have—or even should have—done. What happened? Or has someone shown initiative and done a job you should have done or would have had to do without their help? How did that feel?)

an activity that creates space for personal processing and application



4. PRAY AND DISMISS [PRAY TO GOD | PRAYER ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Fabric squares from "Someone Else's Problem" Activity, fabric markers or permanent markers

WHAT YOU DO:

- Give each kid a fabric square and a marker.
- Direct kids to carefully write on their square **Don't wait for someone else** to do what needs to be done.
- Encourage them to use the Someone Else's Problem (SEP) Force Field to show initiative this week and put it somewhere that a lot of "SEP's" show up in their house: the kitchen, garage, laundry room, etc.
- When they see the SEP Force Field, remind them that this week their name is Someone Else and that they can show initiative and do what needs to be done in that place.
- Close in prayer.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Dear God, thank You that You didn't wait to rescue us from sin. You took initiative and sent Jesus. You planned on saving us from the moment we needed it. Please help us love and serve people that way this week—to actively look for ways to do what needs to be done. We love You, and we ask these things in Jesus' name. Amen."

As adults arrive to pick up, send home the "Someone Else's Problem Force Fields" and explain that kids will use them in places that have a job to be done.

Leader enters, carrying the box of supplies.

OPENER

LEADER: "Greetings, earthlings! I'm really glad you're here, because this month is going to be out of this world. We're taking things to the final frontier. We're getting 'ready for launch' so we can boldly do what needs to be done. That's going to take some initiative!

"Astronauts depend on their initiative to keep them safe. When they see what needs to be done, they don't just ignore it. They do something about it. You and I can take initiative, too—right here on Earth. There are lots of things around us that need to be done. With God's help, we can SEE those things . . . then do something to help!

"We'll definitely need some initiative today for our space travel challenge. In just a minute, you'll pair up [or group up]—and together, you'll use these supplies *(hold up the box)* to make a stomp rocket. We'll take turns launching, and the rocket that travels the farthest will be our winner!

Have kids get in small teams of two or three (or more, if you have a larger group of kids). Try to pair younger kids with older so they're more evenly divided. Give each team their supplies and instruction card.

"Okay, everyone listen up while I explain what to do.

Quickly go through the steps on the instruction card, while holding up the items and demonstrating.

"You have two minutes to make your stomp rocket. On your mark, get set, GO!

Set a timer on your phone for two minutes.

Walk around the room and make sure everyone knows what to do. Help the kids if needed. Call out the time

intervals (one minute left, 30 seconds left), and count down the last 10 seconds out loud.

"Okay, hands in the air. Let's see who can give their rocket the farthest launch!

One by one, invite the groups to stand behind the line and test their rockets. Keep track of which group launched which rocket. (This can be easier if you use differentcolored straws . . . or you could have one kid from each group stand next to their rocket after they've launched it.)

When all groups have gone, congratulate the group whose rocket went the farthest, and collect all the supplies in the box.

"You all did a great job on those rockets! It was NOT easy getting something ready for launch in such a short amount of time . . . but you all showed some real initiative. Let's keep that initiative going as we stand up to sing and worship God!"

WORSHIP

LEADER: "Before we get started, watch this.

VIDEO: Live Loud Video from Get Reel

"When we see something that needs to be done, we can take initiative and do it. After all, we're not just doing it or ourselves, or even for others; we're also doing it for God! We can make a move and take initiative for Him. In fact, let's make a move right now as we sing to God and tell Him how much we love Him!

"Nice job, everyone. You can have a seat."

LEADER: "Nehemiah took initiative to help; and that's something you and I can do, too.

SLIDE: Bottom Line

[Bottom Line] "Don't wait for someone else to do what needs to be done. Say that with me."

LEADER and KIDS: [Bottom Line] "Don't wait for someone else to do what needs to be done."

LEADER: "Let's ask God to help us take initiative like Nehemiah did."

SLIDE: Theme Background

PRAY

LEADER: "Dear God, thank You for the amazing example of initiative we have in Nehemiah. When Nehemiah heard what was wrong in Jerusalem, he didn't wait for someone else to do something. He stepped up to help! We know there are problems all around us, every day, and we know that You can help us be part of the solution. Please give us wisdom to see how we can help, then give us the initiative to get out there and DO it. We love You, and we pray these things in Jesus' name. Amen."

DISMISS

LEADER: "Are you ready to boldly do what needs to be done? We'll talk some more about what that means in Small Group, so let's go!"

Dismiss kids to their small groups.

AUDIO: Play high-energy music as the kids exit. VIDEO: Theme Loop

GETTING READY

Here's everything you need to know to get ready for this week.

<u>STORY:</u> Communicating God's truth in engaging ways (20 minutes) <u>WORSHIP:</u> Inviting people to respond to God (5 minutes)

1. Opener/Closer

 - Large, straight smoothie straw (which must fit over the smaller straw)—ideally in lots of different colors, so you can differentiate the "rockets" from each other
 - o Tape
 - Stomp Rocket Instruction Card (printed from the LG Assets PDF)
 - Masking tape (to make a "launch line")
 - Leader's phone

Music and Sound Effects:

• Upbeat music to use as kids enter and exit the room

Large Group Visuals:

- Theme Loop Video
- Theme Background Slide
- Bottom Line Slide
- Stomp Rocket Instruction Cards (printable)

What You Do:

- Download and print this week's tech sheet for everyone helping with Large Group.
- Download the slides and videos and have them ready to use.
- Download music from a resource such as iTunes[®] and have it ready to play. Note: Legally a song belongs to the songwriter/composer who created it and the publisher who markets it. Performance rights organizations (PROs) license public performances (live or recorded) of their members' music. Usually, but not always, PROs give general permission for performances in worship services. We recommend you obtain permission from the PRO representing the song or the publisher of the song you wish to play. PROs in the U.S. are ASCAP, BMI, and SESAC. For a list of PROs in your part of the world: www.iamusic.com. Look at the copyright on the CD or sheet music to discover the PRO or publisher of the song. It is up to you to make sure your church has permission to perform or play a recording of a song.
- Optional: Download a countdown video from a royalty-free site. Load it into your presentation software and have it ready to play during the Opener. You could also keep time on a smartphone or watch. Note: Some presentation software such as ProPresenter[®] have a countdown clock built into the program that you can overlay on a still image.
- Create a stomp rocket ahead of time, so you can test out the instructions with your supplies. For example, you may need to cut a small slit in the juice pouch, to slightly enlarge the hole so that

the flexible straw can fit inside. Or you may need to cut the smoothie straws in half so they stay on top of the flexible straws.

- Once you're sure the supplies will work, assemble the kits using the gallon-size plastic bags, then place all the kits in the box.
- You'll need one kit for each group. We suggest having two or three kids per group, but you may want to have more kids in each group if you have larger attendance overall.
- Tape a line on the floor for a launching point.

*1. ASTRONAUT TEAM TRAINING

[TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW]

WHAT YOU NEED: Several plastic cups, large rubber bands, yarn or string, scissors

WHAT YOU DO:

- Divide the group into teams of four.
- Cut a 12-inch piece of string for each kid.
- Give each team a rubber band, three cups, and four pieces of string.
- Give the team their Training Mission: use the materials they have to stack the cups into a pyramid without touching the cups with their hands.
- After a while, if the kids are stumped, or if you have younger kids, offer these instructions:
 - Turn the cups upside down on the floor.
 - Tie the end of each string around the rubber band at regular intervals—it will look like a sun with rays.
 - Direct each member to hold the end of the string that is not tied to the band and gently pull the string towards themselves, stretching the rubber band.
 - Instruct the kids to lower the stretched band over the first cup and stop pulling. The elastic will tighten over the cup then the kids can pick it up by the strings.
 - When they have the cup where they want it, direct the kids to pull the strings toward themselves, stretching the band and releasing the cup.
 - Challenge the kids to perform this for all three cups, stacking them in a pyramid.
- If you have mostly older kids, challenge them to make a pyramid of six cups.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"You had to think of some creative solutions to get this pyramid built! You had to think about and notice things you've never have. You had to see these separate pieces—cups, string, rubber bands—in a new way. Then you had to figure out how to put them together. That's initiative!

"When Nehemiah was building the wall, he was full of initiative! But he didn't just stop at solving the problem of the broken-down walls. He recognized other problems, too—like when his neighbors were mistreated. It was too of big a problem to ignore. So he stopped working on the wall and listened to people. He saw where they lived and he took time to understand the problem. Then he did something about it, right away!

"Others probably knew about this problem, but they didn't really SEE it, not the way Nehemiah did. Nehemiah was actively working to **look for ways to make things right.**

"What are some things that need to be made right in your world? How can you stick up for people who are treated unfairly?" (Invite answers. If kids need help getting the conversation started, share a personal story using the suggestion below.)

[Make It Personal] (Share a time when you stepped in to make something right. Maybe you stopped bigger kids from picking on a smaller neighbor, cleaned up a park that other kids had trashed, attended an event that supported racial justice, or used your influence to hold others accountable for their actions. Invite kids to talk about their experiences as well.)

2. NEW POINT OF VIEW [LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Large paper grocery bags, cellophane gift wrap, tape, scissors, coloring materials (*optional*) large cardboard boxes instead of bags

WHAT YOU DO:

- Give each kid a paper bag (or box), and a large square of cellophane.
- Ask the kids to put the bag/box over their heads and have a friend carefully draw a line on the outside of the bag or box where they can feel their eyebrows. This will guide where to make the top of the helmet faceplate.
- When everyone has drawn a line, ask the kids to draw a square on the bag below that line and cut it out, so they have a square-shaped hole in the middle of the bag. This will create the opening for the "helmet faceplate."
- Set out the crayons and markers and invite the kids to decorate their "space helmets."
- Direct kids to cut their cellophane to make a square slightly a little larger than the square hole on their bag.
- Demonstrate how to use tape to attach the cellophane square on the inside of the bag, under the open square, to create the faceplate of a helmet.
- Encourage the kids to wear their helmets during discussion, but take them off before you start a new activity.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"How do things look through your space helmets? Any different? Sometimes all we need is a change to see new things. Now that we see our world in a new light, how can you **look for ways to make things right?** (*Invite answers after each of the following questions.*) Are there kids who need a friend at school or a partner during practice? Is there a kid who gets left out when you're talking with your friends or playing video games together? Who always gets picked last at gym or doesn't have a buddy on field trips? Is there someone you know who gets made fun of because of how they look or talk? Who can you "see" with new eyes this week?

"If we see the problem, we can look for ways to make things right."

Optional Discussion Questions for Older Kids

If you lead 4th, 5th, or 6th graders, consider asking these discussion questions:

- When is it hard to see people in need and look for ways to make things right?
- Nehemiah's initiative to help people cost him time and money. What could your initiative to see and help cost you?
- If the need seems overwhelming, what could you do? Who could you talk with?

3. WATCH FOR IT! [HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Bibles

WHAT YOU DO:

- Look up Colossians 3:23a together in the Bibles.
- Gather the kids in a circle and invite them to sit down.
- Send one kid to the other side of the room so they can't see what happens.
- Silently select a kid still in the circle to be the Alpha Leader.
 - Direct them to make motions that the group must follow: clapping hands, patting their heads, snapping fingers, etc.
 - Instruct the kid to vary the movements occasionally.
- Choose a kid to be the Beta Leader.
- Instruct the Beta Leader to do a different motion than the Alpha Leader (like when the Alpha Leader claps, the Beta Leader can pat their legs).
- Instruct the kids to do the motions of the Alpha Leader, except for the Beta Leader, who will do something different.
- Call the kid back and have them guess both the Alpha and Beta Leaders.
- Continue playing, choosing new leaders each time.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Not only did you have to find the Alpha Leader of the group, but you also had to spot the Beta Leader who was out of sync. It took some time for sure! Our memory verse reminds us to work with all our hearts, and there is no better work than to **look for ways to make things right.**

"It might be difficult at times. You might have to show kindness to someone when you'd rather ignore them and play with the friends you already know. You might need to stop doing something you want to do in order to make things right for someone else.

"How do you think Nehemiah felt about stopping work on the wall to deal with the problems in Jerusalem? (*Invite answers.*) He might have just kept working hard at what he was doing and let someone else take care of the problem. But he knew that as important as the wall was, making sure his people were treating each other fairly was even more important. Nehemiah knew to **look for ways to make things right.**"

"You'll find all the different planets scattered around the room. (Hold up one of the cutouts/balloons/beach balls.) There are enough planets out there for each group to have a full solar system, IF you can find one of each planet!

SLIDE: Solar System (if you're using the paper cutouts), or a picture of your "planets" (if you're using balloons or beach balls)

Note: If you use balloons or beach balls instead of the cutouts, take a picture of them ahead of time that you can show here. That way the kids can see the exact colors that represent each planet. Or you could show them a complete set of the actual balloons/beach balls instead.

"As you can see, we have the Sun, Mercury, Venus, Earth, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, and Neptune.

"When I say, 'Go,' your team needs to find one of each planet and bring them back to your home galaxy, which is where you are right now. *(Explain what you need them to do. For example, tape the planets to their group's posterboard.)* The first team to finish the entire solar system, wins!

"All right, let's see your initiative in action. Let the Solar System Scavenger Hunt begin! On your mark, get set, GO!

AUDIO: Fun instrumental music

Comment on the action. Watch the kids to make sure they don't take extra "planets." If they end up with more than they need, have them hide the extra planets so the other groups can find them.

Congratulate the first group to finish. If possible, let all groups complete their solar systems before you move on. Get the kids to help you put the supplies away before you move on to Worship.

VIDEO: Theme Loop

"Nice job, everyone! You worked really hard to get your solar systems right. Let's sing and celebrate our amazing and creative God who made the whole solar system in the first place. Everyone on your feet!"

WORSHIP

LEADER: "Before we worship, let's watch this.

VIDEO: Live Loud Video from Get Reel

"It's not always easy to take initiative and do what needs to be done, but we don't have to do it alone. We know that God is always with us—and His love makes us want to love others, too. Let's sing to God and praise Him together.

VIDEO: "Make a Move" Dance Moves Music Video

"That was awesome! I'm determined to make a move and show God's love, and today's story will inspire us to do that even more. You can have a seat."

BIBLE STORY VIDEO: Host Intro VIDEO: 252 Story VIDEO: Host Outro

LEADER: "As Nehemiah led the people to rebuild the city of Jerusalem, he looked for ways to treat others fairly and make things right. You and I should do that, too.

LEADER and KIDS: [Bottom Line] "Look for ways to make things right."

LEADER: "When we do that, we can show God's love in a powerful way. It's like Paul wrote in Colossians 3:23, our memory verse for this month.

"Let's pray and ask God to help us."

SLIDE: Theme Background

PRAY

LEADER: "Dear God, it's so cool to hear how You helped Nehemiah make things right. He could have ignored what was happening, but he took the first step to make sure the people were treated fairly. We can learn a lot from what he did. Help us look around and see where things aren't going right . . . where people are in trouble . . . or where they might need our help. Help us speak up and make things right for the people around us. We love You, and we ask these things in Jesus' name. Amen."

DISMISS

LEADER: "In Small Group, we'll talk some more about how we can make things right for others. Let's head that way now!"

Dismiss kids to their small groups.

AUDIO: Play high-energy music as the kids exit. VIDEO: Theme Loop

1. EARLY ARRIVER

WHAT YOU NEED: Offering container, hand sanitizer, foil "moon rocks"

WHAT YOU DO:

- Greet kids by name as they arrive.
- Invite kids who brought offerings to put them in the offering container. •
- Direct kids to use one pump of hand sanitizer.
- When at least four kids have arrived, start a game of "knee soccer."
- Use a "moon rock" as the ball.
- Choose two goal areas.
- Assign two kids to be the goalies.
- The other kids, and any who join later, will be the players.
- Explain the rules.
 - ""Knee soccer" is played like regular soccer, except kids have to stay on their knees and use their hands to throw the ball between themselves and toward the goal.
 - The goalies can block the shots on the goal.
 - No one may stand up at any time.
 - No throwing the ball at anyone's face.
 - No kid may hold the ball for more than five seconds.
 - To make it easier to move, kids can crawl on hands and knees.
- Use more than one moon rock at once to keep the game interesting!

"The problem with these challenges is that our brains can't focus on doing both activities at the same time. *[Transition]* Let's go hear how splitting our focus can stop initiative in its tracks!"

* 1. BRICK, SWORD, MESSAGE [TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW] WHAT YOU NEED: Masking tape path

WHAT YOU DO:

- Divide your group into two teams.
- Send the teams to different ends of the path.
- Teach the kids the hand signals for this game. (It's just like "Rock, Paper, Scissors.")
 - ^a Brick (closed fist): beats sword, defeated by message
 - Sword (first two fingers upright, the rest curled in to palm): beats message, defeated by brick
 - Message (fingers extended, palm flat): beats brick, defeated by sword
- To play, instruct one kid from each side of the path to hop on one foot, one space at a time, until they meet.
- Once the kids meet, direct them to choose a hand signal and play a round of the hand signal game.
- Instruct the winner of the hand signal game to keep hopping toward the other side.
- Direct the other kid to run back to their team.
- Instruct the team who did not win to send out another kid as fast as possible to meet the oncoming winner.
- When the kid who won the hand signal game has either reached the other side or been beaten in another game, direct that team to send out another kid, hopping as before.
- Play as long as time allows.
- The winner is the team that gets the most kids to reach the end of the path.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Our Bible Story last week told us about a big problem that was important enough to stop Nehemiah from working on the wall. But today, we heard about what was NOT worth losing focus over.

"Nehemiah had great initiative in solving problems and helping people, but he had no time for foolish rumors and fears. He could have been up and down those ladders every time someone handed him a new message from his enemies. But he did not. He recognized that all of the talk was a distraction from the real work of strengthening the people and their city.

"Have you ever gotten distracted by what someone else said or did? You want to be kind to your siblings, but they make a rude comment about your hair and you totally forget about kindness. You're working on patience, but a kid cuts in the lunch line and all that work stops while you try to step on the backs of their shoes to get back at them. You don't have to tell me exactly what, but have you ever been distracted by what someone else said or did? (Invite kids to raise their hands—make sure yours is raised, too!)



(*1. BRICK, SWORD, MESSAGE, CONTINUED)

It's important to remember that those Life Apps we work on are worth sticking to! So when someone says or does something that makes that work tough, remember to **stay focused on what needs to be done**."

If you lead 4th, 5th, or 6th graders, consider asking these discussion questions:

- What are some ways you might get distracted when doing the following activities?
 - listening in class
 - reading a homework assignment

2. SPACE DUST

[LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Paper confetti or gift wrap filler, plastic cups, buckets

WHAT YOU DO:

- Play outside if the weather allows!
- Divide your group into two teams.
- Instruct both teams to stand on one side of the playing area.
- Put two empty buckets on the opposite side of the playing area.
- Place the paper confetti (or filler) equally in the remaining two buckets.
- Give each team one bucket filled with confetti and each team member a plastic cup.
- Direct kids to fill their cup with confetti and balance the cup on their head while walking to the far bucket. Then they pour the contents of their cup into the bucket and return to their team so the next kid can repeat.
- Play until all players have had a turn and the buckets that started out full are empty.
- The team with the most confetti in their far bucket, wins.
- Consider adding these rules:
 - Allow younger kids to hold the cup on their head with one hand.
 - If a cup falls off, nothing that fell out of it can be picked up, but kids can put it back on their head and keep walking.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"This game sure took focus! I'm glad there weren't a lot of distractions. What would have been the most distracting thing that could happen while you played this game? (Let kids respond: a fire alarm going off, a stampede of elephants, a celebrity sighting, etc.)

"We don't need anything like that to happen in our daily lives for us to get distracted from doing what needs to be done. When you have a chore or school assignment, what distracts you the most? (*Invite responses.*) Those are the times when you need to remember to **stay focused on what needs to be done.**

[Make It Personal] (Share what distracts you from doing what needs to be done. Also talk about how you get distracted from loving people, serving others, developing patience, etc. Be sure to share hope—what helps you stay focused? A routine? Prayer? Accountability with friends or coworkers?)

"See, everyone gets distracted at times. But that's one of the amazing things about God. He is with us all the time, and He is ready and willing to help us **stay focused on what needs to be done**. You can pray and ask for His help, then look around for what He sends—a friend to coach you through it, a plan to keep going, a parent who can help you work out a tough problem."

3. INSIDE THE LINES

[HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY] WHAT YOU NEED: "Inside the Lines" Activity Pages, kid scissors, large cardstock or small posterboard, poster or tempera paint, paper plates, sponges, Bibles, wet wipes

WHAT YOU DO:

- Give each kid an "Inside the Lines" Activity Page and scissors.
- Direct the kids to carefully cut out the middle letters, making stencils of the memory verse reference.
 - o Let kids decide how many letters they want to cut out. "Colossians" is a long word! If you have time, let older kids cut out as many letters as they can. Otherwise, kids can choose a few letters to cut out and then use the remaining letters to finish the verse reference, like a collage of letters.
- Let them open the Bibles to Colossians 3:23 and write the words of the verse on their poster. (*NOTE: Have them end the verse at "Lord."*) They can get creative with how they write the words, as long as the words are legible and in order.
- Help kids lay out their stencils on their posterboard or cardstock.
- Lay out the kids the paints, paper plates, and sponges.
- Invite the kids to choose their paint color, put a small puddle of it on a paper plate, and carefully sponge it over their stencil.
- When the paint dries, remove the stencils, and look at the verse.
- Invite the kids to use their sponges to decorate the space around the words if time allows.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"What would have happened if we used the sponges full of paint, but didn't have the stencils? Do you think Colossians 3:23 would be as clear as it is now? (*Invite answers*) The stencils focused the paint in one area so we could make the verse reference.

"What things in our lives are like a stencil, helping us focus? Think about routines, reminders, partners at school or on our teams, parents, teachers. (Let kids respond—like a parent who reminds them to stop playing video games and start working; a special table where they do their homework away from the TV; a partner who practices sports drills at recess; a reward system that helps them work toward a goal, etc.)

"There are a lot of ways to **stay focused on what needs to be done**! Don't forget to pray and ask God for help, especially when you're doing the hard work of loving people, helping others, being patient, or making peace. Those things need to be done as much as anything else in our lives, and they take the most focus!"

- Tell the group that the things Nehemiah tried to focus on were the wall and keeping his people safe, NOT the messages from his enemies because they were a distraction.
- Invite the kids to come up with hand signals that symbolize what their focus could be split by.
- Ask the kids to pray silently and ask God to show them which of these things need to be done this week-which of these things needs their focus and initiative.
- Close your group time in prayer.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Dear God, thank You for giving us what we need to stay focused on what **needs to be done**. Please show us the important work You have for us this week. We love You, and we ask these things in Jesus' name. Amen."

As adults arrive to pick up, set the memory verse posters where families can pick them up.

Today's Bible Story: Ain't No Stoppin' Us Now (Nehemiah and Sanballat) • *Nehemiah 2:19-20, 4,* 6

Today's Bottom Line: Stay focused on what needs to be done. **Monthly Memory Verse:** *Work at everything you do with all your heart. Work as if you were working for the Lord.* Colossians 3:23a (*NIrV*) **Monthly Life App:** Initiative—Seeing what needs to be done and doing it **Basic Truth:** I can trust God no matter what.

AUDIO: Play high-energy music as kids enter. VIDEO: Theme Loop

Leader enters, carrying the plastic bin with the beanbags.

OPENER

LEADER: "Hello, my fellow humans! I'm so glad to see you. We're having a great time this month as we find out what it means to take initiative. We're getting 'ready for launch' and learning how to boldly do what needs to be done! That's what initiative is all about.

"We don't have to let things just happen TO us. With God's help, we can take the initiative to lend a hand and make things better for the people AROUND us.

"We'll get started today with a fun game that will definitely take some initiative. I've got some asteroids here (*toss up a beanbag*) that could threaten Earth . . . and we've got to do something about it. The only solution is for us to toss them into a black hole (*toss a bag toward the board*)—never to be seen again. Well, until we pick them up and let the next person toss them, of course.

"We'll divide into two teams: the [color] team (hold up that color beanbag), and the [color] team (hold up the other color beanbag).

Drop the beanbags in two piles at the front of the line.

"When I point to you, go ahead and line up behind the tape line, behind the color I tell you.

Divide the kids into two teams by pointing to kids and telling them their color (alternating between the colors). As you point to the kids, they should get in line.

"All right! We have our teams. When it's your turn to toss, try to get the asteroid into the black hole *(point to the hole on the board)*. Then head to the back of the line. We'll play for exactly one minute, and I'll keep track of how many asteroids each team can get in in that amount of time.

"Your team captains are [kid's name] and [kid's name]. (*Point to the first kid in line for each team.*) When your team is out of asteroids, I'll call your captain down to pick up your team's asteroids from the board and bring them back to the front of the line so you can keep going. Remember, you need to take turns tossing—so one person from the [color] line, then one person from the [color] line, and so on. Make sense?

"All right, let's launch those asteroids and see how many you can get in the black hole! Sixty seconds on the clock. On your mark, get set, GO!

VIDEO: Countdown (60-second version)

Stand near the dry erase board and keep tally of each team's number of successful throws. Encourage the team captains to gather their team's beanbags after the last one is thrown, then drop them at the front of the line.

When the countdown is over, count up the final scores and congratulate the winning team. Get the kids to help you collect the beanbags in the plastic bin.

VIDEO: Theme Loop

"Way to go, everyone! You successfully eliminated those asteroids from planet Earth. While you're on your feet, let's dance and sing as we worship God together!"

WORSHIP

LEADER: "Did you know that we can show people what God is like by the way we live each day? We can take initiative and show God's love with the way we act, the way we speak, and the way we treat others. As the apostle Paul wrote in 1 Corinthians 10:31 (*NIrV*), 'So eat and drink and do everything else for the glory of God.' With every move we make, we can point others to God. Let's sing this song together and tell God that we want to make a move for Him!

"Great singing, everyone! You can have a seat."

CLOSER SLIDE: Theme Background

LEADER: "We can learn something really important about initiative from Nehemiah and the rest of God's people. We can . . .

SLIDE: Bottom Line

[Bottom Line] "stay focused on what needs to be done. Say that with me."

LEADER and KIDS: [Bottom Line] "Stay focused on what needs to be done."

LEADER: "Let's talk to God and ask for His help, just like Nehemiah did!"

SLIDE: Theme Background

PRAY

LEADER: "Dear God, thank You for helping Nehemiah and the people stay focused and complete the job You gave them. There are so many things that could have distracted them—just like there are so many things that can distract US today. Please help each of us *[Bottom Line]* stay focused on what needs to be done—and give us the initiative to see things through to the end. We love You, and we pray these things in Jesus' name. Amen."

DISMISS

LEADER: "Let's head to Small Group and talk about how we can stay focused-together!"

Dismiss kids to their small groups.

AUDIO: Play high-energy music as the kids exit. VIDEO: Theme Loop

- Place the beanbags in the plastic bin.
- Practice tossing beanbags to determine the optimal distance. You want it to be possible for the kids to toss beanbags through the hole, but it shouldn't be TOO easy. Once you find the right distance, tape a line that the kids can stand behind.

***1. SPACE CELEBRATION PART 1** [TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW]

WHAT YOU NEED: Shelter materials, paper tablecloth or long roll of craft paper, and coloring materials; (optional) magazines or grocery store flyers with pictures of food; scissors; tape or glue sticks; and snacks **If providing snacks, be aware of food allergies in your group.

TODAY'S BIBLE STORY

WHAT YOU DO:

- Build a shelter using the shelter materials—as outlined in Getting Ready. •
- Gather the kids in the shelter.
- Roll out the paper tablecloth or craft paper on the floor.
- Direct the kids to use the coloring materials (or the optional food pictures) to create a celebration feast on the "table."
 - Instruct the kids to draw plates, cups, and utensils on the table.
 - Remind kids to draw food, as well, if you're not using food pictures from magazines.
 - Encourage the kids to decorate the tablecloth with pictures of flowers, centerpieces, candles, or other "fancy" touches.
- Once the table has been prepared, gather around the table for discussion.
- (Optional) Serve your group a snack to celebrate.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"What a feast! What were God's people celebrating in our Bible story today? (finishing the wall and the holiday of Sukkot)

"God's people had built the wall and gates in 52 days! That's amazing. Nehemiah knew that it wasn't just the people's hard work that had gotten the wall built. God had seen them through, just like Nehemiah said He would when they started!

"So Nehemiah and the rest of God's people gathered to honor God and listen to Ezra and the priests share God's Word. As the people listened, they became sad. Do you remember why? (They realized that they hadn't been following God very well—even though He had done so many good things for them.)

"But Ezra and Nehemiah told the people not to be sad. Why? (because that day was a holy day to celebrate what God had done)

"That's right! It was Sukkot or the Feast of Booths! It was time to celebrate, not to be sad! Nehemiah and Ezra reminded God's people to look for ways to celebrate what God has done. They told the people to build shelters, just like you guys have! And to celebrate the Feast of Booths.



(*1. SPACE CELEBRATION PART 1, CONTINUED)

[Make it Personal] (Share a time in your life when you found comfort in remembering what God has done—for you, your family, or His people—even in challenging circumstances.)

"God has done so much for us, and He is still working every day. There is always something to celebrate when we're following Jesus. So keep your eyes open and **look for ways to celebrate what God has done**." (If you're serving snacks, hold them up here like a toast as you repeat the Bottom Line.)

2. SPACE CELEBRATION PART 2 [LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Music player or phone app to play upbeat worship music, at least one foil moon rock from "Early Arriver"

WHAT YOU DO:

- Instruct kids to sit in a circle. (Ideally inside your shelter if space allows!)
- Give the moon rock to one kid.
- Start the music.
- While the music plays, direct the kids to pass the moon rock around the circle.
- Stop the music abruptly.
- Instruct the kid holding the moon rock to say one thing they can celebrate today. (It can be something from the Bible story, something God has done or given them, etc.)
- To vary the game, pretend to play on different planets where the gravity is different.
 - On the moon, the rock would feel super lightweight and the kids could pass it quickly.
 - On Jupiter, the rock would feel so heavy the kids would have to pass it around with two hands and drag it a little on the ground.
- For older kids, introduce a rule that there can be "no repeats". Kids have to come up with something new to celebrate that hasn't been said before.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Wow! What a great way to **look for ways to celebrate what God has done!** I liked that we all had something special and unique to share. (*Repeat a few of these to the group.*) I don't know that I would have thought of some of these things on my own.

"This story all month has had a lot of ups and downs. The walls were ruined, then Nehemiah led the people to rebuild them. The people were excited about rebuilding the walls, except when they were starving. The people's enemies were making fun of them, but Nehemiah ignored them. The wall was finished, but the people realized how far they'd wandered from God.

"All of this over 52 days! Have you ever had a time in your life that felt like that—kind of like a rollercoaster? (Invite answers but be sensitive to kids who might have special challenges or difficult circumstances.)

"Nehemiah and Ezra knew that the best thing to do when life seems topsyturvy is focus on God. They reminded the people that they could always **look for ways to celebrate what God has done.** And we can do the same thing God's people did in our Bible story."

3. SPACE CELEBRATION PART 3

[HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY] WHAT YOU NEED: "Blast Off and Base Station" Activity Pages, "Verse Words" Activity Page cards, masking tape, Bibles, (optional) small pieces of rope or paracord if you don't want your kids to hold hands.

WHAT YOU DO:

- Tape the "Base Station!" sign on the shelter you made.
- Tape the "Blast Off!" sign as far away as possible in your small group area.
 - Instruct the group to line up at the Base Station.
- Give each kid a "Verse Word" card to wear as their badge and a piece of masking tape.
- Direct the kids to tape their "Verse Word" to their shirts.
- Explain that the goal is to get to Base Station and back (after going to Blast Off!) with the verse words in order, without breaking their tether.
- The tether is either hand-holding or the small pieces of rope provided.
 The kid who has the first word goes first, taking a step towards Base Station, then holding one hand of the kid with the second word to "tether" them.
- The second kid stays tethered to the first with one hand then stands closer to the Base Station.
- The kid with the third part takes the hand of the first kid, then the second kid, to stand even closer to Base Station.
- At the end of the verse, the first kid has to move "tethered" up the line to stand next to the last verse word kid. If this is at Base Station, great, if not, keep going!
- Essentially, kids are inching closer and closer to Base Station, one kid at a time, while staying tethered together, like astronauts would be in a spacewalk.
- When the whole group has made it to Base Station and back to Blast Off, the game is done!

WHAT YOU SAY:

"You needed to work together to get safely to Base Station and back. One of the things about initiative is that it never stops. You need initiative for the Blast Off stage, the traveling stage, the building of the Base Station, and the journey back home. Then it starts all over again!

"Do you think that sounds tiring? (*Invite responses.*) Me, too! I think that's why our verse reminds us that we're really working for God. When we see a job that needs doing and we do it, we're showing that we are ready to help with God's good plan for the world.

"God is always at work. When we show initiative and do hard work, we remind everyone around us that God is working in everything, even when we can't see it. That's why we have to **look for ways to celebrate what God has done**."

WHAT YOU NEED: Shelter from "Space Celebration Part 1" Activity

WHAT YOU DO:

- Gather kids in the shelter.
- Tell the kids that the Jewish people, who are Nehemiah's descendants, still celebrate Sukkot—the Feast of Booths—today. And when they do, they pray a special prayer.
- Instruct the kids to repeat after you to pray this prayer that's similar to a traditional prayer of Sukkot below.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Blessed are You, our God (*pause*), Who has kept us alive (*pause*), (*pause*) sustained us, (*pause*) and brought us to this season (*pause*). Help us, today and always, (*pause*) to look for ways to celebrate what God has done. (*Pause*.) Amen.

"I can't wait to hear how you learned to **look for ways to celebrate what God** has done."

As adults arrive to pick up, invite them to check out your shelter and celebration meal. Make sure kids take home their Crazy Calendars and "moon rocks."

Today's Bible Story: I Just Want to Celebrate (The Wall Is Rebuilt) • *Nehemiah 3–4, 6:15-16, 8:1-17*

AUDIO: Play high-energy music as kids enter. VIDEO: Theme Loop

Leader enters.

OPENER

LEADER: "Greetings, earthlings! It's been a great month so far at [your environment's name]. We're finding out how we can boldly do what needs to be done . . . with initiative!

"God can help us take initiative so we notice the things around us that aren't quite right or the people who need our help. And we don't just SEE those things. We do something about them! We lend a hand. We make things better. We show God's love in everything we do and say.

"To kick off our time today, I thought we could have some fun with our very own SPACE-lebration. See what I did there?

"We have four games to play during our space party, so we'll orbit around the room to play! First, let's divide into two teams—the [color] team and the [color] team.

Divide the group into two teams, making sure to evenly divide among ages. Have the teams line up in two different lines, next to station #1.

"At each station, only one person from each team can go at a time. When that person is finished, the next person in line goes, and so on.

Move around the room to each station. Explain how to play each game and demonstrate as you explain.

"We'll start here with station number one. As you're probably aware, there's no gravity in space. Which means you're weightless! It's a weird sensation, and we'll get a taste of it with this 'weightless race.' First, you'll pick up a spoon and close your eyes—no peeking! While your eyes are closed, you'll attempt to pick up a cotton ball, carry it to your team's bucket, and drop it in. It doesn't SEEM hard, but when you can't tell how much something weighs, it's tricky! At the end of the race, we'll see which team got the most cotton balls in their bucket.

"One you've tried to drop in your cotton ball, you'll come over here to station number two—the 'moon rock bounce.' Here you'll try to transport a moon rock (*hold up a balloon*) from one side of the moon—I mean room—to the other. Just grab a balloon, start at either line, and bounce your balloon all the way to the other line. You can hit your moon rock in the air, but it can't hit the ground. If it does, bring it back to the starting line and try again. As soon as you make it across, move on to station number three.

"Station number three is the 'Saturn ring toss,' where you'll pick up a ring (*hold up a hula hoop*), stand behind the line, and attempt to throw the ring around Saturn (*point to the beach ball*). Each person will get two chances to try to land a ring.

"Lastly, we'll finish up with station number four, the 'rocket ship portal.' You'll make a paper rocket like this (hold up the completed paper airplane), with paper in your team's color. Then stand behind the line, launch your rocket, and try to get it through this portal (point to the hanging hula hoop). There's no need to wait your turn here at station number four. Once you get here, go ahead and make your rocket and launch it. If you see someone who needs help folding, go ahead and help them.

"When all of you have finished all four stations, I'll tally the points, and we'll find out which team is victorious. Let's go—starting off with [kid's name] and [kid's name] in the weightlessness race! (*Reference the first two kids in line.*) Three . . . two . . . one . . . blast off!

AUDIO: Fun instrumental music

Comment on the action, encouraging the kids as they complete each section. Remind them of the rules if necessary.

When everyone has completed all four stations, add up the teams' points. Count the number of cotton balls in each team's bucket from station #1. Ask the kids to raise their hands if they landed a ring around Saturn at station #3, and if they got their rocket through the hoop at station #4. Add these numbers together on the dry erase board and come up with the final point totals for both teams. (Don't worry about being too exact on this; just keep it moving.) Congratulate the winning team.

"Amazing, everyone! That was out of this world! You saw what needed to be done at all of those stations, and you got . . . it . . . done. Talk about initiative! Stay on your feet, because now it's time for us to sing to God and celebrate His love."

WORSHIP

LEADER: "When we take initiative, we can jump into action and do what God has called us to do. It's like what Paul wrote in our memory verse, Colossians 3:23. Say it with me."

SLIDE: Memory Verse

LEADER and KIDS: "Work at everything you do with all your heart. Work as if you were working for the Lord." (Colossians 3:23, NIrV)

LEADER: "Let's sing this song together and tell God that that's exactly what we're going to do—make a move and live for Him!

VIDEO: "Make a Move" Dance Moves Music Video

"It's so fun to sing and celebrate God with you! You can have a seat."

BIBLE STORY VIDEO: Host Intro VIDEO: 252 Story VIDEO: Host Outro

CLOSER SLIDE: Theme Background

LEADER: "God is always there to help us make wise choices, give us strength when we need it, and help us make things right with other people. He has a good plan for our lives. *[Basic Truth]* We can trust Him no matter what!

"Remember . . .

SLIDE: Bottom Line

[Bottom Line] "Look for ways to celebrate what God has done. Say that with me."

LEADER and KIDS: [Bottom Line] "Look for ways to celebrate what God has done."

LEADER: "Let's talk to God right now and thank Him for being so good to us."

SLIDE: Theme Background

PRAY

LEADER: "Dear God, thank You for all that You've done for us! First of all, You made us, and You love us. You sent Your Son to die for us so we could live with You forever. Then there are all the wonderful things You've done for each of us individually in this room. You've given us family and friends, a roof over our heads, food to eat, and clothes to wear. You've given us a purpose and a good plan for our lives. We could start celebrating all that You've done now, and never stop. We are so thankful! We love You, and we pray these things in Jesus' name. Amen."

DISMISS

LEADER: "There's SO much that we can celebrate when we take the initiative to look for it. In fact, we can talk about that some more in Small Group. Let's go!"

Dismiss kids to their small groups.

AUDIO: Play high-energy music as the kids exit. VIDEO: Theme Loop
